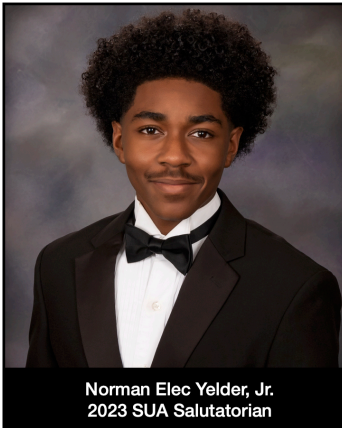


Matthew Kyle Armont
